External Scholarships: Many external scholarships can be found and applied for by students independently from Midwestern. The Student Development Offices keep a small file of external scholarships that students are free to review, make copies and apply. Internal Scholarships: Midwestern students benefit each year from a variety of scholarships donated to assist students with their educational costs. Every effort is made to ensure the wishes of the donor by ensuring each recipient meets the guidelines and scholarship criteria. Scholarships are competitive and are based on three areas: Academic performance, ministry involvement, and financial need.

(NOTE: Midwestern seeks to assist many students with scholarships, but scholarships rarely cover all of a student's tuition costs. Students applying for internal scholarships should expect to look for other supplemental money as well.)

Student Eligibility:

1. Most scholarships are available only to students who maintain a cumulative 3.0 GPA.
2. Enrollment as a Full-time student: Masters – nine (9) hours per semester; Undergraduate – Twelve (12) hours per semester.
3. Admissions application must be completed and fully admitted into a degree program.
4. Scholarships are not available for J-term courses. The award(s) will be listed as a credit to the student's account to cover school-related expenses as listed on the student's school account.
5. Applications are due in the Financial Aid office by July 15 for the Fall, Dec. 15 for the Spring.

Selection

Recipients may be selected by any of the following criteria:

Administration and/or Faculty recommendation
Academic achievement (GPA)
Academic major or field of study
Future ministry plans
Additional stipulations established by the donor (hometown, church,
etc.)
Financial need

Donors may stipulate any or all of the above criteria as a measurement for candidate selection. When multiple applicants are eligible for a scholarship, the Scholarship Committee will determine the recipient.

Award

Contingent upon the above eligibility requirements, recipients of scholarships will be notified. If any recipient should lose his or her eligibility for any reason, that scholarship will be awarded to the next eligible applicant.

Admissions Scholarships

Presidential Academic Excellence Scholarship - \$500.00 to new, full-time seminary or college admits with a GPA of 3.5 or higher in college or high school. Scholarship is for initial Semester of enrollment only.

Midwestern Student Scholar Award - to new, full-time College admits with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Midwestern will match \$250.00 for any student whose church donates \$500.00 or more toward their education.
