The **Master of Arts in Theological Studies (MATS)** is a 15 course/45 credit hour degree program that is offered entirely online offered by Midwestern Baptist College, SBC the college division of Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. The MATS degree is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. Restrictions on the number of online credit hours that may use to satisfy MDiv, MACE, MACM, MACO, MA-BA or –BL degree requirements apply – a maximum of 30 hours of online/distance education courses are permitted.

Students may enroll in a maximum of two MATS online courses without obtaining approval of their advisor and the director of the MATS program.
