Prior to Criswell, he was Dean of Boyce College at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary and has over 15 years of pastoral experience in Texas, Colorado, and Kentucky. Johnson holds a B.A. from Criswell College, an M.A. from Denver Conservative Baptist Seminary, and a Ph.D. from Southern Seminary. His leadership in the Southern Baptist Convention includes chairmanship for both the Board of Trustees of Southern Seminary and the SBC Committee on Order of Business. He and his wife, Rhonda, have two children.

He has served as an evangelist, church planter, pastor, and interim pastor of several congregations. He is married to Sharon, and they have four children: Kristi, Jonathan, Kari, and Karisa.

\$50/\$50 DEAL >> An extremely effective way of recruiting students is word of mouth advertising.
