Lieutenant Commander Scott N. His current research interests include Hebrew linguistics, Old Testament narrative, and Old Testament intertextuality. He is married to the former Chingman Cheuk of Hong Kong, and they are the proud parents of Josiah Daniel, born in July 2005.
