Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and Spurgeon College may offer occasional courses in conjunction to study trips. These study trip courses may be offered at a reduced tuition rate in order to offset the total cost of students having to pay for travel involved in going on these trips. The Office of Academics will work with the professor of each of these courses to determine the total cost of the trip based upon travel costs. All fees associated with course enrollment will still be charged to students enrolling in study trip courses (i.e. Registration Fee, Technology Fee, and Journal Fee). Due to the nature of needing to plan for travel, all payments for the trip must be completed 1 month prior to the first day of the study trip course. Tuition refunds will be given to students who drop out of the course after the 1st day. Travel cost refunds will be at the discretion of the travel agencies used. Doctoral Students wishing to take Study Trip Courses as a seminar will need to setup up a

Directed Study through the Doctoral Office, and will be charged the published Directed Study Fee as part of their enrollment.
